Choosing communal cremation

What to consider:

- Is it important that your pet stays with you?
- Have you considered scattering their cremated remains in a meaningful place?
- Would you like to keep your options open and decide how to memorialize them at another time?

If you answered 'yes' to any of these questions

We suggest you choose private cremation. Private cremation ensures their remains are not mixed with that of other pets, allowing for a much wider variety of personalized memorialization options. You'll also receive a certificate of cremation authenticating their cremated remains, which will be returned to you.

What to consider:

- Is cost a primary factor in your decision-making process?
- Are you sure you do not want to memorialize their cremated remains, now or in the future?

Communal cremation may be what's right for you. With communal cremation fewer memorialization options are available and your pet's cremated remains will not be returned to you.
